MACRO-ECONOMIC OVERVIEW


There has been a fall in the rate of inflation in the second quarter of 2023, as had been predicted by the Bank of England when we reported last quarter. The Consumer Prices Index (CPI) fell from 10.1% in March 2023 to 7.9% in June. This is due largely to the fall in the “housing and household services” contribution (primarily electricity and gas bills) to the annual CPI inflation rate which can be seen quite clearly in Figure 1. However, along with rises in the cost of food and non-alcoholic beverages, these remain the largest contributory factors to the inflation rate that households suffer, as has been the case since April and September 2022, respectively. Food and non-alcoholic beverages inflation is still very high (although falling), standing at 17.4% in June. Its recent high of 19.2% in March 2023, was the highest annual rate seen for over 45 years.¹

The economy appears to have settled at an uninspiring flat-lining level of growth after the massive decline and subsequent bounce-back due to the Covid pandemic 2020-21 (see Figure 2). GDP showed no growth in the 3 months to May 2023 when compared to the three months to February 2023. Manufacturing output continues to perform badly and the previous estimates for it from the ONS have been revised downwards. Interest rates were raised by the Bank of England on the 21st June 2023 with the Bank Rate rising from 4.5% to 5% in a further attempt to reduce inflation which is proving to be more persistent than expected and higher than in other G7 countries.

Some measures of labour market tightness have eased. The unemployment rate has been slowly rising, standing at 4% in May 2023 whilst the employment rate has slowly increased over the last year and the vacancies to unemployment ratio fell in the three months to April, to its lowest level since October 2021 (see Table 1).




CORPORATE CHANGE IN CUMBRIA: APRIL - JUNE 2023

With the exception of the announcement in May that the Lakeland Inns Group had gone into liquidation, the second quarter of 2023 has seen reports of much corporate investment and innovation in the County (see Tables 2 and 3). This has been particularly true in the Accommodation and Food Services sector where six new businesses have been reported as opening (see Toast, Windermere; The Grapes, Whitehaven; Haithwaite Farm, Penton; Bordo Lounge, Carlisle; Burger King, Carlisle; Salt Fish and Chips, Seascale) bringing at least 144 jobs whilst many others are expanding in size to accommodate more guests/customers. Experiential tourism is also leading to business innovation in this and the Recreation sector (see Our Farm, Cartmel; Haithwaite Farm, Penton; Storrs Hall, Windermere; and Netherby Hall, Longtown). However, data from Cumbria Tourism's Business Tourism Tracker 2023² reveals another side to these media reports. The combination of rising costs of bills, reduced visitor spending and staffing issues portends a challenging time for many businesses in Cumbria's tourism sector. Although international tourism expenditure in the United Kingdom rose significantly in 2022 over the previous year, the number of overseas resident visits to the UK in 2022 had not caught up with pre-pandemic figures (see Figure 3). According to Autumn 2022's 'Cumbria Tourism Business Performance Survey', 25 per cent of tourism vacancies in Cumbria are unfilled, with up to 50 per cent of positions in some businesses vacant. 89 per cent of businesses said that there was a lack of affordable housing in the area and 84 per cent said it was too expensive for staff to travel to work.³


Food and Drink retailers and manufacturers have also been prominent in innovation and development of new products/flavours (see Winter Tarn Dairy; Hawkshead Relish and English Lakes Ice Cream; Cumbria Distilling Company; Grasmere Brewers and Distillery; Cumbria Cow Ice Cream; Grasmere Gingerbread). The County is known for its Food and Drink offering and this quarter has seen awards and accolades going to a number of its butchers, bakers, chefs and distillers.

A prominent cross-sectoral feature seen in this quarter has been investment by firms in new technologies to reduce energy consumption or to switch to renewable energy sources. This has been reported in several firms (see Electricity North West; Muncaster Castle; The Crown Hotel, Wetherall; James Walker and Co.; James Cropper; Green Hydrogen Energy Company Limited; and Energas).

The Red Flag Alert database system contains data on over 3 million active companies nationally and 36,000 in Cumbria. Businesses are financially rated from Gold (stable, little risk) down to 3 Red Flags (highest risk of failure). In line with my previous comment about current tough trading conditions for firms, the Red Flag Alert found that in June 2023, 60.5%⁴ of Cumbria's companies on the system were rated as having Red Flags or provisional Red Flags (based on only one year's set of accounts) compared to 48.0% nationally (see Figures 4 and 5) and these are worrying findings.


